## Discussion at Last Meeting:

### Keep the Job Clean

The most effective way to control debris and trash is to eliminate the hazard at its source rather than trying to control it later. Good housekeeping pays off in many ways, here are the top 3:

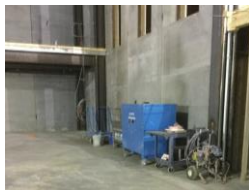
- It helps us operate more efficiently and get the job done quicker.
- It helps us get the job done safely. It is a fact that most slips, trips, and falls could have been prevented by good housekeeping practices.
- No one likes working in a mess: you are more likely to take pride in your job, mainly quality, and keep it clean if it's clean to begin with.

### How to help?

- Put debris in trash carts.
- Store materials neatly. Put items used more frequently in the front for easy access.
- Clean up material banding as you work.
- Keep hallways/stairways clear at all times.
- Take care of tools and equipment. Do not leave them where they could cause trip hazards.
