We are approaching when slippery walkways could become an issue on our projects, so we need to take corrective actions to prevent this. We need to communicate with our Foreman where we have slippery walkways, either in the building or outside in the parking lot. Our Foreman will direct our concerns to the General Contractor's Superintendent to address the issue. This issue can easily be resolved using sand, de-icer or by getting the snow and ice cleaned out of the work area. If your Foreman's request is not met, he/she may need to get our Superintendents or PM's involved. They may direct us to resolve the issue for them.

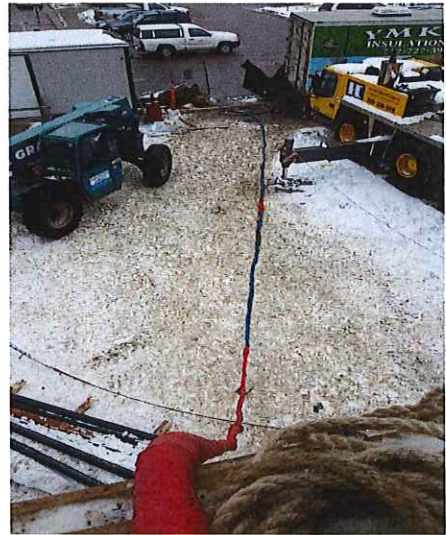
