What is the "Most Important Factor" that will contribute to the safety of all Olympic employees in 2019 and why?

Knowing exactly what the day has in store for each of us is VERY IMPORTANT. Having a clear head and a good night's sleep is key to starting each day, but before actually starting work, a Pre-Planned Work Day is vital.

All of our work can be pre-planned. Intuition, awareness, training, learning from others, continued education, wrong doings, etc. ALL aid in our ability to Pre-Plan. Pre-tasking your day and your crew members day will significantly raise the bar on safety.

Pre-planning the days tasks, the week out tasks, and even month out tasks, and all of the safety concerns that comes with the foresight, is not the *Most Important Factor* for safety, but it is the *FIRST Most Important Factor* since it happens before we step out onto the jobsite to start our day.
